# MASTER TUNG'S POINTS FOR THE HEART

SP - ST Meridians

88.01, 88.02, 88.03 - Located on the anterior midline of the thigh, above the superior edge of the patella.

88. 01 - 5 cun above, 88.02 - 7 cun above, 88.03 - 9 cun above

Indications: Heart disease, cardiac pain, palpitations, tachycardia, hypertension.

CI – Do not needle all 3 points on both thighs at the same time, for HTN select only 1 or two points at a time.

## ST MERIDIAN POINTS

77.08 – 3 cun inferior to ST 35, very near ST 36 Indicated for palpitations and heart disease.

77.09-4.5 cun below 77.08, or 0.5 cun above ST 38

Indicated for heart disease, arteriosclerosis and carditis.

## MASTER TUNG'S POINTS

SI Channel – 33.12

On the SI meridian 1.5 cun below the olecranon.

Indications: palpitations, chest oppression, carditis.

CI: Do not needle bilaterally.

SJ Meridian –

33.04 (SJ 6) – palpitations

33.05 – 5 cun above the wrist crease on SJ line

33.06 – 6.5 cun above the wrist crease on SJ line

33.05 and 33.06 indicated for chest pain, stuffiness, and distension

## MASTER TUNG'S POINTS

#### Liver Channel

66.03 – (LV 2) / 0.5 posterior to LV 2

66.04 – 1 cun proximal to 66.03 (proximal to LV 3)

Indicated for heart diseases, palpitations, cardio-tonic affects.

\*CI in Pregnant Women

#### Spleen Channel

SP 9 – Treats heart disease and palpitations.

66.10 and 66.11 (SP 3 and SP 4)

The above points are used with KI 2 to clear heart fire and restore balance between the HT and KI.

CI to needle both sides.

# MASTER TUNG'S POINTS

Many of the points we mentioned are to be used for heart diseases, but not necessarily heart patterns as understood in TCM.

TCM Heart Patterns don't necessarily mean there is a heart disease as recognized in Western medicine.

The points we have just discussed treat heart conditions as recognized in Western medicine.

#### HEART CONDITIONS

When treating heart conditions as recognized by Western medicine, we need to do pattern identification, and using a meridian based perspective can better help us to determine exactly what points to use.


# HEART QI DEFICIENCY

Since Meridian Circuit Systems takes a very personalized approach by asking about the clients top 3 concerns, potentially any circuit could be used. However, the most common circuits for treating Heart Qi Vacuity are:

Shao Yin - Tai Yang Circuit

Jue Yin - Yang Ming Circuit (66.03 and 66.04 tonic effects)

# HEART QI DEFICIENCY



#### HEART YANG VACUITY

Heart yang vacuity is often rooted in the KI.

This circuit makes use of the UB back shu points and SI 3. According to five elements the GB can strengthen the heart, while the SJ transports the KI yang.

This circuit is the most important one. Notice how the SP is present and is usually involved in this pattern.

88.01, 88.02, 88.03 – these points are also for cerebral anemia.



66.03 and 66.04 on the liver meridian have cardiotonic effects.

Yang ming is full of qi and blood and PC 6 benefits the blood and yin wei.



77.08 and 77.09 on ST meridian are often bleed for heart conditions.


Shao Yin – SP/SJ circuit

To be used if patient also presents with KI symptoms, edema, or excess fire

# HEART BLOOD STASIS



### HEART YIN VACUITY

#### Shao Yin connects to:

Tai Yang – back pain, sciatica, urinary conditions also present.

Shao Yang – dizziness, tinnitus, Meniere's, HTN, shao yang sciatica

SP/SJ – digestive concerns, excess fire, gynecological patterns.

Master Tung's Point prescription for heart fire, disharmony between the KI and HT. (SP 3, SP 4, KI 2)

Jue Yin – KI/LI circuit may be useful in some situations, although usually the SJ will be used instead of the LI.

#### Shao Yin – Tai Yang

- 2. Low Back Pain



# SUMMARY OF HEART PATTERNS

Since the heart does not exist in isolation we need to consider its connecting meridians and organs.

The Shao Yin is the fundamental connection between the HT fire and KI water.

The Jue Yin is associated with the connection between the LV wood and the PC fire.

From the Shao Yin and Jue Yin the heart connects to all other organs and meridians and this can be systematically understood.
